Letter from the President

Dear Friends,

As summer ends and autumn brings vibrant colors and colder mornings, we adults often take time to slow down and reflect on the passing year. Have we accomplished our goals? Are we happy? Do we know our direction for the upcoming year, which, for many of us, arrives much faster than it used to?

At Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Northwest Indiana, autumn is also a time for reflection for us as an organization. A new school year has begun, filling our Clubs with both familiar and new Club kids who look to us for guidance and support. For kids and teens who are still developing their self-confidence, having adults who believe in them can make all the difference, and our Club staff are committed to providing that steady, kind presence for all our kids.

While we know that adult mentors like our staff can't solve all challenges, we strongly believe that having a kind, caring adult who can help kids learn about themselves and the world in a safe, comfortable environment can make all the difference. In fact, research from *The Chronicle of Evidence-Based Mentoring* shows that youth with natural mentors are more likely to have more positive attitudes about school, have higher expectations for academic success, perform better in school, and be more socially successful. Evidence also suggests that they have higher incomes as adults.

I have personally seen this to be true as a trained Boys to Men mentor of middle school children where I know beyond a shadow of a doubt that I make a positive difference in their lives. I also know with the same conviction that our Boys & Girls Clubs staff make the same difference in the lives of our Club kids every day.

Boys & Girls Clubs provide inclusive and safe places, caring mentors, and life-enhancing programs that boost youth self-esteem, build confidence, and contribute to overall health and well-being. That investment in our Club kids pays off for our communities too: 94% of Club kids report that they try to help when they see people in need,

and 92% of Club kids report that if something is really hard, they keep working at it. These are the kind of friends, neighbors, and

coworkers we want in our communities.

Providing these spaces, mentors, and opportunities for our kids to learn and grow comes at a high cost, as you can imagine. It costs us about \$2,400 to provide a year's worth of services to just one child, while families pay just \$50–\$75 per year for Club membership. With that membership, a child can spend every day after school at the Club until 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday, and until 6 p.m. on Fridays. Where else can you get that kind of amazing, safe, supervised, high-quality childcare, academic help, STEM, art, athletic opportunities, and so much more for less than 10 cents per hour?

As always, our mission continues to be funded locally through wonderful donors and friends like you. Your compassion and commitment make this incredible community service a reality for families and for our nearly 8,500 Club kids, summer campers, and league athletes each year! As our operating costs and need for our services continue to increase, we rely on your kindness and generosity to keep our Blue Doors open across our nine clubs in Lake and Porter counties. Without you, Clubs don't exist. Let's keep making this difference in our communities TOGETHER.

RETURN TO LEARN RECAP

Thanks to our wonderful supporters, we surpassed the University of Chicago Medicine \$100,000 match by raising an impressive \$186,594 during our 2025 Return to Learn Campaign! This annual fundraiser, which coincides with the beginning of the school year, ensures our kids have the resources and support to learn, explore, and grow.

TOLLESTON PROJECT UPDATE





Construction is in full swing at the Tolleston Opportunity Campus! The new structures for the Methodist Health and YMCA facilities are rising alongside the future John Will Anderson Boys & Girls Club. To begin the full, state-of-the-art renovation of our facility (including upgrades to the arts room, STEAM lab, and dance studio), the Club will temporarily close in January. Our kids will attend the Lake Station Club until the spectacular new facility is ready in 2026.

This isn't just a rebuild, it's also a real-world learning lab. Our CONSTRUCT program, supported by Berglund Construction and Powers & Sons Construction, is giving middle and high school students hands-on experience in design, engineering, and safety on our building site.

As John Will Anderson Gary Club Director Brianna Griffin noted, "It's amazing to see three entities coming together to provide promising futures for our youth." We were also honored to host Congressman



Frank J. Mrvan for a site tour in September, where he witnessed this powerful community collaboration firsthand.



Our leaders received specialized training using the Clifton Strengths Assessment as part of our commitment to continual improvement. MLB PITCH, HIT & RUN


